Range Name:	302	
Fire Danger Code:	0 – 30 (BLUE = LOW)	Use normal caution. Any type of ammunition may be used with care. Smoking is permitted. This is the highest allowable FDR for LFAM training without a waiver.
	31 – 40 (GREEN = MODERATE)	Use normal caution. Fire will start easily. Any type of ammunition may be used with care. Smoking is permitted.
	41 – 60 (YELLOW = HIGH)	Use extra caution. Fire will start very easily. The beginning of the high danger period. Any type of ammunition may be used, with care, on ranges and within impact areas. It is recommended that the use of pyrotechnics, demolitions, and heat or flame-producing devices within training areas be limited as much as possible to cleared areas or areas previously burned for that purpose.
	61 – 80 (ORANGE = VERY HIGH)	Use extreme caution. Fires are very hard to control. Firing will be permitted at all times on all ranges unless restricted by range control. Minimal use of pyrotechnics, demolition, and heat or flame-producing devices (including blanks and smoke grenades) is allowed within training areas; however, their use is restricted to cleared or previously burned areas only.
	81 & Higher (RED = EXTREME)	Flash condition. This is the highest class of fire danger. Fires started are practically impossible to extinguish and usually continue until danger rating conditions improve or they burn themselves out. The utmost caution with fire producing agents and devices must be exercised at all times. The firing of high explosives, pyrotechnics, incendiaries, or other ammunition likely to cause fires is prohibited unless specifically authorized by range control.

Area Suitability

Range Use Restrictions/Comments/Conflicts:

1. Maneuvers are not authorized.
2. Authorized for night use. Night vision devices authorized
3. Movement beyond 100 meters is prohibited unless escorted by EOD personnel. Unit must contact EOD for support. All personnel, equipment and vehicles must remain clear of area.
4. BZO/Zero targets are only authorized within the first 100 meters of the range. All designated firing will be direct towards the impact area.
5. Units must provide appropriate target material. EOD support not required for targets placement within the designated 100 meter firing area.

Other Considerations:

1. This range is affected by the local Municipal Airport. Range control will alert the range OIC/RSO when incoming aircraft give notice of their arrival. However, low flying planes may periodically fly over ranges without notice. Any weapon systems firing above the 300-foot ceiling will be affected. The Range OIC/RSO will call a cease-fire and contact range control for all exercises when planes fly in below the 300 ft ceiling. Range Control will contact the range OIC/RSO when normal training can resume.

Special Instructions:

1. Be familiar with the SOP.
2. Bivouacking not authorized on range.
3. Digging on the range is not authorized except that required for the sole purpose of proper deployment and safety of designated weapon systems. Prior to departing the range, the unit will ensure all sandbags are removed, holes filled in and leveled.
4. All firing must be conducted in designated pits.
5. Report all maintenance problems to the Range Inspector following the exercise.
6. A scarlet streamer is continuously flown at the entrance to the range and another scarlet streamer will be provided for placement at the adjacent tank trail when the range is hot.
7. The Corpsman/Medic must be present on the range prior to commencing training. The Corpsman/Medic will be located with the safety vehicle behind the center of the firing line.
8. Tracers are not permitted for use on the range when the base is at Fire Danger Codes orange or red.
9. All non-participating or observing personnel will remain near the tree line behind the firing line and outside of the range fan.
10. All personnel must wear helmets, flak jackets and hearing protection while on the firing line or within 50m behind the firing line.
11. Using unit is responsible for a detailed police call of the range, all facilities, dumpster area, and parking/staging areas when training is completed. The unit will ensure the removal of all dunnage from the range to include tactical wire, wood, and scrap metal is removed from the range.
12. Range must be inspected and cleared by a range inspector prior to departing range/training area.
13. OIC/RSO will complete and submit a range report upon completion of training and turn-in of range.
